The morning will begin with muffins and coffee at 8:00 am at the Rogue Regency Inn, Medford. After some networking time, the bus will leave at 8:20 am. The bus will stop at Pacific Crest Transformers, a leader in the design and construction of custom liquid filled transformers. They offer electronic component manufacturing custom to each project, from the design for manufacturability process, to box build solutions, through complete functionality testing, logistical support and delivery to the end customer.

An extended tour of Rogue Disposal and Recycling is next. Visitors may not be aware that Rogue Disposal includes Rogue Compost, the Dry Creek Landfill, a Gas and Oil Facility and a Gas to Energy process. Visitors on this tour will get to the big picture. Rogue Disposal and Recycling manufactures compost that is approved for organic farm and garden use. In addition, Rogue Disposal takes methane from its landfill and turns it into electricity that powers 3000 homes in the Rogue Valley. The Gas and Oil Facility will be the host for a lunch catered by Talon Grill.

The afternoon concludes with a tour of BIOMed Diagnostics. Founded in 1990, BIOMed Diagnostics manufactures a variety of unique microbiology diagnostic devices for clinical and animal health testing. Their easy to use technology saves time and money, improves

workflow and reduces exposure and contamination risks to testing samples and clinicians. BIOMed's innovative microbiology media is making specimen collection and diagnosis easier and more cost-effective across the country and the world.
