


## Unemployment Rates Declining

#### Unemployment in Medford (MSA) Below 5%




#### Medford (MSA) House Price Index

- 1. Most jobs are back, but still of lot of unfilled positions
- 2. Unemployment rates are down, 4.6% in Medford MSA and 5.3 % in Grants Pass MSA
- 3. Consumers are saving oodles of money!
- 4. Rogue Valley is recovering well, compared to state and Portland MSA
- 5. Leisure and Hospitality Industry still lagging

#### COVID-19 Job Changes Compared to Great Recession Job Changes






#### Monthly Unemployment Insurance payments are back down near pre-pandemic levels in the Rogue Valley.









Online ads in Grants Pass metro area increased by 90 in November.




#### Homes for sale in Medford MSA, increasing but still in short supply.






